Logistics:

- Download anything you may need in advance as service in the hills is inconsistent at best.
- Many local hangouts close by 9PM, only accept cash and are closed Sunday-Monday. Call ahead.
- If you are staying at one of our properties during a snowstorm, please be aware if you are at one of the more remote rentals on a gravel road, you may need to prepare to lengthen your stay in case you cannot get out. How exciting!
- If you decide to seek adventure, go on a full tank of gas. There are printable maps <u>here</u>.

Libations:

- Stone County is a dry county BYOB; however, if you left town in a hurry to get here:
 - ~30 minutes up Highway 14 in Big Flat, AR, you will find:
 - Blanchard Liquors: West on Hwy 14 past county line. Cash/check only. Pricey and limited selection. We're just thankful we have something!
 - Gravity BrewWorks: 11512 Hwy 14 Easy, Big Flat, AR 72617; (870) 448-2077
 - Open most Thursdays-Saturdays, noon-8PM; Call ahead during winter
 - This is our nanobrewery. Home to our favorite Great American Beer Festival gold medal winning brewer! Here, you'll discover tantalizing craft beers & locals spinning tall tales or jamming in the beer garden.
 - ~40 minutes up Highway 66 in Leslie, AR, you will find:
 - Ryan's Main Street Grill: 508 Main Street, Leslie, AR 72645; (870) 447-2264
 - You may find a dance partner here, as well as a well-seasoned steak.

Ozark-St. Francis National Forest: These trails are incredible!

- Birding & Hiking: over 360 miles of trails for hiking, including the 165 mile Ozark Highlands Trail. Backpacking: Five designated wilderness areas, including the Hurricane Creek Wilderness Area.
- Three multi-use trails for ATV's, mountain biking, horseback riding & hiking. Over 160 miles of year-round driving along scenic byways.
- Canoeing, White Water Canoeing, Fishing: Blue Ribbon rivers, six Congressionally designated Wild and Scenic Rivers.
